In a cast of 6, some lines must be pre-recorded. Please refer to the appendix for a guide.

For a cast larger than 9, remove doubling as seen fit. Additional background actors may populate most scenes.

MARIA, CANDICE, JANELLE, MRS. LOWRY, NICOLE, and EMILY must be played female. DAN and BRYAN must be played male. Other roles may be played as any gender and renamed accordingly.

HOW TO READ THIS SCRIPT

This play is comprised of **sequences** (clusters of scenes) and **moments** (individual scenes). The way in which scenes are numbered in this play is a boldface **X-Y.**; where X represents "sequence" number and Y represents "moment" (scene) number. Transitions between *moments* are meant to be fluid and playful, moving from one to the next as though the same scene. Sequences end with a BLACKOUT and a page break.

PRODUCTION NOTES & PRE-APPROVED CHANGES

If DAN is not cast as East Asian, you may change his surname to Parker. If MARIA is not cast as Latina, you may change her surrame to Wolcott. While this play is not explicitly about race it is not incidental that DAN and MARIA are written with tradition non-white last names. This is a story about power, privilege, and visibility. When casting and designing DAN and MARIA, it is imperative to position them as outsiders to the comment of the powerholders in an American high school. Consider casting performers who may be neurodivergent or disabled, LGBTQ+, of ethplc or religious minority, or any intersections thereof; and/or styling them to appear lower class or with very niche interests. The overall point is muddied or lost altogether if MARIA and DAN are presented as no different from CANDICE, JANELLE, and BRYAN.

The scrim is optional if your production lacks resources for one.

The kindergarten flashbacks may be handled by (A) casting children to play the kindergarten versions of DAN, MARIA, JANELLE, CANDICE, and BRYAN or (B) having the actors playing their teenage selves double as their kindergarten counterparts. Mr. Fenton sees merit to both approaches.

You may translate the Spanish to any other foreign language and credit the teacher as its equivalent of "Mrs. Blevins". The Spanish Class scenes aren't about the Spanish.

It is Mr. Fenton's intent that this story is set in 2024 in the USA, specifically in Bucks County, PA. If you so choose to update to the present year, your production MUST do the following:

1. Adjust DAN's kindergarten year to 12 years ago

- 2. Adjust MRS. LOWEY s graduation year to 28 years ago
 3. Assess whether the references to Tom Holland, John Cena,
 Anderson Cooper, Hanger Games, Squid Game, The Godfather, social
 media/generative AI/other tech platforms remain relevant and update accordingly
- 4. DO NOT UNDER MY CIRCUMSTANCE cut/update the references to:

 -Catcher in the Rye by J.D. Salinger

 -Peter Pal by J.M. Barrie

 - -How to Vin Friends and Influence People by Dale Carnegie -How the Frinch Stole Christmas by Dr. Seuss
 - -How the Trinch Stoll -Corrie by Stephen King by Arthur

 - -The Crucible by Arthur Miller
 - "Behemian Rhapsody" by Queen
 - Me Sound of Music
 - Mean Girls
 - ednesday
 - Greek mythology
 - -The Bible

Intermission for this play is optional. Mr. Fenton would choose not to have one. If you so choose to take intermission, place it after 10-3.

CHAMBER STONE HIGH SCHOOL, a public high school in a well-off Philadelphia suburb in Bucks County, Pennsylvalia. October 4, 2024. The set is very simple to allow for various locations to be represented through minimal set pieces. A projector scrim feature.

Chamber Stone High School is home to the Dragons, their colors contain a deep green. Many posters advertising the Homecoming Queen vote are hung around the set.

A young woman's voice on the morning announcements:

"Good morning, Chamber Stone High Today is Friday, October 4th, 2024. In case you forgot, your homecoming queen will be crowned tomorrow."

AT RISE: Whand-painted poster reading "VOTE FOR MARIA" features next in a line of other sterile, professional posters for other nominees.

"And now, over to a video interviewing this year's homecoming court."

Charming, bright, and jaded high school senior DAN PARK (17) enters.

DAN

Some men just wanna watch the world burn. And I should know, because I'm one of those men.

He touches Maria's poster.

DAN

"All this for a queen."

MRS. LOWRY

1-2.

GUIDANCE OFFICE. October 4.

Dan looks up to see sporty, seasoned guidance counselor CHRISTINE LOWRY (40s).

I know. I know.

MRS. LOWRY

Unless you plan to hurt somebody, anything you share does not leave this office.

DAN

All right, all right. Fine. Here's what happened Miss Rogers. You know Miss Rogers, right?

MRS. LOWRY

I do know Miss Rogers.

1-3.

ENGLISH CLASSROOM. September 26. English teacher fresh out of undergrad, MORGAN ROGERS (22), enters. Dan rises.

DAN

Yeah, girl's like four years older than me. Look at her.

MISS ROGERS

Good morning, class! I'm Miss Rogers. I graduated from West Chester five minutes ago and I'm ready to change the world, one child at a time.

Dan glances aside.

DAN

Sure.

So anyway, I'm senior now. I'm not taking crap from anyone at this school anymore. That includes my teachers. I needed to size this girl p.

He fake-hyperventilates.

MISS ROGERS

Daniel What's wrong?

DAN

Where's my paper? Everyone else got theirs back.

MISS ROGERS

M--oh my goodness. Didn't I? I--

DAN

Did you lose my paper, Miss Rogers?

Miss Rogers actually hyperventilates. Dan flashes a smirk.

MISS ROGERS

Hang on! I'm gonna find it, and then we're gonna make it right, OK?

DAN

(Laying the guilt trip on thick.)

OK.

Miss Rogers exits.

1 - 4

GUIDANCE OFFICE. October 4.

MRS. LOWRY

And this paper?

DAN

Oh, yeah, straight up did not do t. Haven't even opened my copy of Catcher in the Rye.

MRS. LOWRY

Dan.

Christine.

MRS. LOWRY

Mrs. Lowry.

DAN

Mrs. Lowry.

MRS. LOWRY

While I'm-horrified--that you gaslit a teacher. That's not why I called you in.

DAN

Yeah know.

MRS. LOWRY

I watched your video. You gonna tell me a story or what?

DAN

In the interest of--um. Is there any detention or suspension on the line here, or...?

MRS. LOWRY

I see what you did there.

DAN

Allegedly.

MRS. LOWRY

What you allegedly did there. I'm impressed.

DAN

Is this a trap?

MRS. LOWRY

Should it be?

Pause.

MRS. LOWRY

I want a story. And if you're not going to kell me the truth, at least entertain me.

DAN

Challenge accepted.

MRS. LOWRY

Why don't we start at the beginning?

DAN

A very good place to start.

Pause.

The year was 2012.

MRS. LOWRY

Oh -- no need to go back that far.

DAN

The year was 2012.

MRS. LOWRY

Dan, what does this have to do with--?

DAN

The year was 2012, Christine. It was the first day of kindergerten. Um. All I wanted was a friend. And there she was--

1-5.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PLAYGROUND. 2012. YOUNG DAN (5, can be played by teenage Dan) sits lonely on the blacktop.

A perky nonconformist, YOUNG MARIA (5, can also be played by teenage Maria) enters and taps him on the shoulder.

YOUNG MARIA

You're Danny Park, right?

Dan rises.

YOUNG DAN

Oh--yeah. Hi.

YOUNG MARIA

I just moved here from Virginia. Your mom's name and picture was on a sign right in front of my house. "Kathy Park"--

YOUNG DAN

How did you --? You can read?!

YOUNG MARIA

You look just like her.

YOUNG DAN

Do you wanna finger paint with me

YOUNG MARI

As a matter of fact, I am the pest at finger painting.

YOUNG DAN

Not sure you know who you're messing with.

YOUNG MARIA

I'm Maria.

YOUNG DAN

Dan.

YOUNG MARIA

I know.

1-6.

GUIDANCE OFFICE. October 4.

MRS. LOWRY

Maria a sweet girl, I do really like her.

On scrim: A photo featuring field hockey goalie Maria and Coach Lowry.

MRS. LOWRY

Great goalie, too!

DAN

Yeah.

On scrim: Images flash by of Young Dan and Young Maria in their childhood friendship, growing into awkward, artistic tweens.

DAN

She--she's my best friend.

MRS. LOWRY

So I've gathered.

DAN

See--the thing about Maria. She is never now Maria. That's always been exactly who she is.

MRS. LOWRY

One of her best qualities.

DAN

Yeah. That's cute in elementary school. But then puberty hits you like a truck. By eighth grade you're always looking over your shoulder. Trying to see who's looking. Who's laughing. And before you know it, you start senior year and you've worked so hard to get from scrawny nerd to—well, I'm still a scrawny nerd. Never gonna be like Bryan McGrath or anything. But I'm a nerd with a little power now. And someone like Maria—

A pause.

MRS. LOWRY

So, are you gonna tell me a story or what?

DAN

Yeah.

On scrim: An image of Young Maria reaching down to Young Dan.

DAN

This is the story of how I did a bad thing. For a very good person.

BLACKOUT. A school bell rings.

2-1.

HALLWAY. September 5.

On scrim: One Month Earlier.

AT RISE: Spunky artist/athlete WASIA ROJAS (17) is at her locker with her large field hockey bag.

Dan enters. He keeps his listance.

MARIA

Good morning, Danny!

DAN

What's up, Rojas?

MARIA

It was super dead on my shift last night, so I got a chance to bust out my pastels!

She shows off her latest art piece. It's quite good.

DAN

Oh -- you're still doing that.

MARIA

I am! What do you think?

DAN

It's great.

MARIA

Thanks! You been making anything? I'd love to see it.

DAN

Yeah, I'm not ... taking art this semester.

MARIA

Wanna borrow my pastels?

DAN

Maybe sometime.

MARIA

Just let me know when!

DAN

Hey, you do the calc homework yet? What was it?

MARIA

103, 1 through 41, every other odd!

Cool. Thanks.

MARIA

My pleasure!!

She exits.

Establishment politician in the making-think teenage Kamala Harris-CANDICE DAVENPORT (17) enters, pusting together a display for Homecoming Court in a hyper-fixated trance.

DAN

Hello--

Candice jumps back, startled.

CANDICE

Oh--hey. I'm in a bit of a rush here.

DAN

Need any help?

CANDICE

I've got Bryan, so I'm al set. We've got a system going.

Candice's impossibly perfect telnis/honors student boyfriend BRYAN McGRATH (18) enters. Captain America in the flesh.

DAN

What's up, Bryan

BRYAN

Oh, ya know. Keeping busy. Got an away match at Eastern Bucks later. Maybe I'll take this one on a proper date.

He touches Candice gently.

BRYAN

How are you, dude?

DAN

Same as I've always been.

He pulls a poster off the display.

CANDICE

Do you mind?

"Cast your vote for homecoming queen". Already time, huh.

BRYAN

We're going on the announcements today to kick things of. Unsealing this envelope. Gonna make a few girls' days. Maybe their whole year.

He hands Dan an envelope labeled "CONFIDENTIAL".

BRYAN

It's top-secret stuff.

CANDICE

"Seven outstanding female role models were determined by an independent committee of faculty and staff for the privilege of being nominated--"

DAN

(To Candice.)

Think you're on the list?

BRYAN

I'd bet money on it.

CAMDICE

Well, the Homecoming Queen should be a young woman of exceptional intellect and character. Not some basic bimbo.

The sweet, conventionally attractive (think Legally Blonde) JANELLE BORDEAUX (18) enters. She sees a poster.

JANELLE

Oh my god! ** s nomination day!

CANDICE

Anyway They gave student council the prime spot.

BRYAN

They put us right after they say what's for lunch and before the moment of silence.

CANDICE

pulled some strings.

DAN

Your email was very clear that's where you wanted it.

CANDICE

Oh--yeah. Duh. Thanks?

Don't mention it.

BRYAN

See you in gym, man!

DAN

Can't wait.

Bryan gives Dan a playful punch on the shoulder and takes Candic 's hand. They step away from Dan.

CANDICE

It's better if you're the one to read the names. You know. Just in case.

BRYAN

In case of what? You can say your own name.

CANDICE

But what if it's not there?

BRYAN

Come on, babe. It's a dumb popularity contest, right?

CANDICE

Yeah. But--

BRYAN

My queen either way.

He kisses her on the cheek and flashes a grin--his shiny white teeth may audibly glisten. Dan rolls his eyes.

Bryan and Candice exit. Dan realizes he is still holding the envelope.

DAN

You--vour envelo--

He inspects the "CONFIDENTIAL" label.

DAN

Hamecoming nominees, huh...?

MRS. LOWRY (OFF STAGE)

Dan!

2-2.

GUIDANCE OFFICE. October 4.

MRS. LOWRY

You didn't.

DAN

Excuse me. Seven outstanding female role models were chosen independently by a committee of faculty and staff for the privilege of being nominated for homecoming queen.

Plus, my handwriting's terrible.

MRS. LOWRY

Dan.

DAN

Christine.

As I was saying. I took the envelope--which was sealed--down to the TV Studio, because the morning ann uncements were about to start.

MRS. LOWRY

You're too much.

TV STUDIO September 5. Dan crosses to the control booth and puts his headset on. Janelle sits at the anchor desk, holding her lapel mic and speaking into

JAMELLE

Did you see it's nomination day?! I totally forgot. I should've dressed up.

Dan looks up at Janelle and pauses. She's dressed and styled especially nice.

DAN

You--?

He decides not to comment.

JANELLE

Should I pretend to be surprised when they announce my name? That would be rude, right? I'm a terrible actress.

DAN

☑m sure you're fine.

JANELLE

No, I'm serious. You remember Sound of Music last year? I wanted to be the Baroness, but Henderson made me the nun who says "a clown".

Yeah. I was running lights.

JANELLE

Oh! Yeah. Duh.

A school bell is heard ringing

MR. HAWKINS

All righty, Dan: start 'er off.

Candice enters, flustered.

CANDICE

Hey! Has anyone seen my--um--?

Dan holds up the CONFIDENTIAL envelope.

CANDICE

Thank god.

DAN

Don't mention it.

Candice exits. Dan pushes a button to switch on the "On Air" signal. BIACKOUT.

News fanfare plays.

on scrim: A high school video production class-quality title sequence plays.

DAN (IN THE DARK)

Janie, you're on in three, two--

3-1.

ART CLASSROOM & TV STUDIO. September 5

AT RISE: Janelle sits at the arch r desk with piercing shiny eyes and a radiant smile.

JANELLE

Good morning, Chamber Stone. I'm Janelle Bordeaux. Today is Thursday, September 5th, 2024.

Dan sits wearing his headset and digging out his calculus textbook.

DAN

Run the lower third.

He opens the textbook and flips to the answers at the back, not looking up.

JANELLE,

Lunch today will be pizza sticks. There is no Hot Combo.

DAN

Play it out.

(Into his hic--still not

looking up.

Switching to Camera &.

Candice and Bryan enter. He carries the envelope.

JANELLE

And now for a special message from Student Council.

CANDICE

Good morning / Chamber Stone.

BRYAN

Beautiful day in Bucks County!

JANELLE

ule is

CANDICE

This is your student body president, Candice Davenport.

BRYAN

And I'm your treasurer, Bryan McGrath.

(Eyeroll.)

Bryan.

He turns down Bryan's microphonesilencing him in the middle of his sentence.

BRYAN

The Homecoming Dance is an institution at Chamber Stone High and with it comes the coronation--(of the Homecoming Queen.)

MR. HAWKINS

Something going on with Bryan's mic?

DAN

Oh--uh. No idea, Hawk. Let me just..

He turns Bryan's sound back up.

DAN

Think I fixed it!

BRYAN (CONTINUED)

--one exceptional female role model to represent the Class of 2025.

Lights up on the Art Classroom, where Maria doodles in a sketch book, not really paying attention.

JANELLE

I've been waiting for this since freshman year.

CANDICE

I'm sure you have

JANELLE

What are you waiting for?! Open it!

BRYAN

Pleasure's all mine. Ladies.

He tears open the envelope, freezing halfway through. All freeze except Dan. The lights change as he narrates.

DAN

Something you gotta understand: I don't give a crap about any of this. I was literally copying answers from the back of my calc book. But when I heard that envelope slice open, I felt a shift in the air. The whole world was about to change. And for a little chaos goblin like me, this is Christmas morning.

Lights return as Bryan opens the envelope. All unfreeze.

On scrim: Typed first names of the first six nominees appear as sroken

BRYAN

Your class of 2025 Homecoming Court: Nicole Beckett. Jahelle Bordeaux.

JANELLE

(Squealing.)

You shouldn't have!

CANDICE

I didn't.

BRYAN

Kendra Cline. Candice Davenport.

Candice postures herself.

BRYAN

That's my president! Emily Hodges. Allison Stauber.

He pauses.

CANDICE

You only said six names.

Action freezes again. Lights change again to indicate a sidebar from Dan.

DAN

Listen, Jan Me / Nicole. Emily. It's the entire cheer squad. Their boyfriens would all shove me in a locker given the chance, but they're nice, pretty girls. Of course they were getting nominated. Class President Candice, you know, she's gorgeous, she's going to Princeton—no surprise. But truly not a ringle person was ready for the last name on the list.

Action resumes, lights return.

CANDICE

Who's that?

JANELLE

Well, don't tell me someone put my name twice!

BRYAN

Maria Rojas!

CANDICE

Maria Rojas.

JANELLE

Maria Rojas.

On scrim: A handwritten name joins the six typed ones -- MARIA.

MARIA

(Pleasantly surprised.)

Maria Rojas.

All freeze. Light: drop off the Art Classroom and TV Studio. Spotlight on Dan as he rises.

3-2

DAN'S IMAGINATION. Continuous. The stage is backed in a manic red wash.

DAN

That sweet, sweet name. Maria Rojas. So I was sitting there. I was thinking about all these wonderful female role models. And the golden boy. And me. When you look like me, and you just--are--like me. You getta fight so hard for your spot in the pecking order. Never gonna get invited to the game, never gonna be offered a spot I/didn't carve out myself. But I did it. By some miracle, I did it! You don't count Dan Park out. Ever.

But every so often, something like this comes around. Some shiny thing jumps in front of them like Bryan McGrath or a tiara—and I'm reminded all over again how little I matter. So what if I burned it all down?

What if I did everything in my power to put the crown of the Homecoming Queen on Maria Rojas's head? I could see it now:

Janelle, Candice, Maria, and Bryan unfreeze.

CANDICE

Full-scale Battle Royale!

JANELLE

No. Squid Game!

MARIA

These girls would plunge the school into chaos!

BRVAN

Everyone would run for cover!

JANELLE

First the lights would go out--

The lights drop out. Spotlight on Candice pulling out a big sword.

CANDICE

Then Candice gets Janelle in the jugular.

Spotlight on Janelle pulling out a comically large medieval battle axe.

JANELLE

There would be blood! Blood everywhere!

Spotlight on Bryen

BRYAN

It'd make the Hunger Games look tame.

CANDICE

I'd sharpen my knives.

JANELLE

I'd throw my battle axe.

BRYAN

Hey, maybe it'd hit Bryan on the way! Wouldn't that be fun?

Spotlight on Maria, with a crown on her head, bouquet and sash in her hands.

MARIA

But in the middle of it all... sweet Maria Rojas. Holding a bouquet and a sash

Spotlight on Dan.

DAN

Forget dumping a vat of pig's blood on the queen. They'd all do it for me. And the best part is, when no one pays you any real attention, you can bet away with anything.

BLACKOUT.

4-1.

FIELD HOCKEY PITCH. September 5. Posters for Candice and Janelle are now hung around the set.

CANDICE (IN THE DARK)

May the best girl win.

JANELLE (IN THE DARK)

Best girl win.

A coach's whistle is heard.

AT RISE: Field hookey practice just finished. Coach Lorry sees Maria linger at goal.

MRS. LOWRY

You can head out, Rojas. You did good today.

MARIA

Eh. I let 'em get to me more than sual today.

MRS. LOWRY

I didn't notice.

MARTA

I did.

MRS. LOWRY

Something on your Mind?

MARIA

Did you hear I've been nominated for Homecoming Queen?

MRS. LOWRY

I sure did! How are you feeling about it?

MARIA

It--it has to be a mistake, right?

MRS. LOWRY

Maybe. Maybe not.

MARIA

It's super cool. But I think I'm gonna turn it down. Is there way I could do that?

MRS. LOWRY

Why?

MARIA

I have no shot.

MRS. LOWRY

Oh?

MARIA

Oh, don't get me wrong! People like me. But they mostly ust leave me alone.

MRS. LOWRY

I'm surprised you don't have more friends.

MARIA

I have everyone I need, really. Mom, Dad, people at work. My brothers and sister.

MRS. LOWRY

Fair enough. You might not need anyone else, but--

MARIA

Oh! And Danny Park's my best friend

MRS. LOWRY

I know Dan. Keep that boy in line will ya?

MARIA

Would if I could.

A minivan car horn is heard.

MARIA

That's my ride. Thanks for chatting, Coach!

MRS. LOWRY

You want my advice:

MARIA

Always!

MRS. LOWRY

Get out on the field.

I'd have for you to stay in the goalie box just 'cause it's comfortable there.

MARIA

Well if you're taking me out of goalie, Coach, I'm not prying defense. I wanna be a striker.

MRS. LOWRY

Go get 'em.

Mrs. Lowry exits. Maria crosses to the Astronomy Classroom.

4-2.

ASTRONOMY CLASSROOM. September 6. Meria takes a seat. Candice enters and sit in the desk next to Maria.

MARIA

Good morning, Candice! Congrats!!

CANDICE

Thank you. Have you voted yet? You know, you can scan the little code right here--

She pulls out a large campaign poster with an unmissable QR code.

CANDICE

And vote up to ten times a day until Ortober 4th!

MARIA

Yeah, I'm not doing that.

CANDIC

Well, you can.

MARIA

I probably won't.

CANDICE

But everyone votes for Homecoming Queen.

MARIA

I actually never have Plus, I'm technically nominated this year, so--

CANDICE

Yes! Congratulations!! Oh, wow. Yeah.

MARIA (CONTINUED)

--woulan't that be against the rules?

CANDICE

That's respectable of you, but no.

MARIA

Noted. I still probably won't, but it's sweet that someone mominated me.

CANDICE

It is. And only one of us can win, anyway.

Candice rises, poster in hand.

CANDICE

It's reassuring to know the committee valued intellect and character when they chose this year's court.

MARIA

Lar

JANELLE

(To Emily and Nicole.)

Omigosh, she's a real person!

MARIA

I've lived on your street since we were five.

JANELLE

None of us knew who you were. Nicole was convinced your name got on the list as a joke.

MARIA

You and me both!

NICOLE

Cool.

JANELLE

But like, your name isn't a funny name. Which is why I thought you were probably real.

MARIA

Yep, well--here I am.

JANELLE

I was stalking all over the socials trying to find you yesterday.

MARIA

I only have Instagram for my art, ictually.

JANELLĘ

Your boyfriend must be so proud.

MARTA
